 - (c) If you need to add additional background to make the problem statement understandable, include it before the problem statement. It should be brief, however: do not include more than one page of background material. Try to be concise with your background knowledge. If you have background knowledge, add sections to your assignment called 'Background' and 'Problem Statement'.
 - (d) Do not include any description of how you are going to solve the problem or evaluate any solutions. State the problem only.
